



## **Oliver Parks and Recreation Society**

### **Grant-In-Aid Guidelines**

**The Oliver Parks and Recreation Society is supportive of the many contributions that various non-profit organizations make to maintain and enhance the lifestyle of the community. Organizations wishing to apply for a cash grant-in-aid must comply with the following guidelines.**

1. All organizations must provide both a cover letter confirming their eligibility for grant-in-aid and the information requested on the accompanying application form.
2. The activity or project must be non-profit in nature and contribute to the enrichment of the community life or be a service that warrants public support
3. In general, only volunteer organizations are eligible.
4. Sports groups may be eligible if competing at a provincial or higher level providing that the team or organization has demonstrated support to Oliver Parks and Recreation operations throughout the year.
5. Applications should be received as early as possible in order to provide adequate time for the Society to consider the request.
6. The activity or project must clearly be of a recreational nature.
7. Financial assistance given from other sources will be taken into consideration when applications are reviewed.
8. Consideration will be given to requests from organizations for special projects or activities of a community nature. Such grants are designated as seed money for specific projects without any commitment to continuing support.
9. Generally, only one request per organization will be considered per year.
10. Successful applicants must report in writing to the Society providing details as to the success of the activity or project. Failure to do so may result in the rejection of future applications.
